I. Call to Order

A. Chair Bhagowalia called the meeting to order and confirmed quorum at 1:11 p.m.

II. Approval of Minutes – January 24, 2013

A. Member Yee motioned to approve January 24, 2013 minutes. Member Thornton seconded. Vote to approve unanimous.

III. Public Testimony

- A. There were three members of the public present at the meeting. No public testimony was presented.

IV. State Technology Awards Ceremony

- A. The Office of Information Management and Technology presented 297 awards to State government employees at the State of Hawaii Technology Awards on Friday, February 15, 2013. The event recognized and celebrated those who have engaged in various activities to support the Business and IT/IRM Transformation efforts. Each awardee was presented with a certificate signed by the Governor and the State of Hawaii Chief Information Officer.

V. CIO Updates

- A. Hawaii Broadband Initiative (HBI)

The Governor's vision is for HBI to provide 1Gbps to every household by 2018 ubiquitously and affordably. OIMT briefed and received strong endorsement from the Governor on the progress of HBI and its outlined strategy. One key element of the initiative will be stakeholder outreach and presentations on the web.

Member Lassner suggested a video explaining why the State is committed to Broadband and what's in it for the residents.

Another program related to HBI is the federal FirstNet program, which is broadband for public safety first responders.

The State is also proposing a secure transpacific landing site to address potential providers bypassing Hawaii in lieu of Oregon or Los Angeles.

- B. Enterprise Resource Planning (ERP)

Five key milestones for the ERP project have been accomplished:

1. Business Feasibility Study
2. Benchmark State skills assessment
3. Benchmark Security readiness
4. Develop ERP Requirements
5. Draft RFP for ERP Solution

The ERP solution will replace 126 disparate systems to support finance, time and attendance, payroll, human resources, grants management, acquisitions management, and asset inventory management.

Interim solutions for budget, grants, acquisition and inventory management will be created.

- C. Projects and Acquisitions (Supplemental: FY 13)

OIMT has about \$25.3M to spend thru June 30, 2013. Investment areas include:
