Establishes a permitting, application, review, and approval process for wireless service providers to install wireless facilities on state or county owned utility poles, or install associated utility poles, in the right of way. 	SB2515 RELATING TO STATE EMPLOYMENT Repeals the authority for department heads to establish positions for special, research, and demonstration projects approved by the governor. SB2879 RELATING TO EDUCATION Requires the office of enterprise technology services, in collaboration with the department of education, to establish a working group to study the department of education's information technology infrastructure, operations, and services.
	SB2960 RELATING TO INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY Makes the state chief information officer subject to hiring and dismissal by the information technology steering committee, rather than the governor, and removes the chief information officer as chair of the information technology steering committee. Requires the information technology steering committee to elect a chairperson from among themselves.
