A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that government
2 transparency, in the form of the free flow of information
3 between the government and its citizenry, allows the public to
4 review government decisions and provide meaningful feedback by
5 way of engagement in the political process. The electorate, now
6 well-informed on the decisions and actions taken by its
7 government, may responsibly express their approval or
8 disapproval through the electoral process and through the
9 formulation of policies and procedures promulgated through
10 administrative procedure.

11 The legislature further finds that capital improvement
12 projects are construction projects that provide improvements or
13 additions to land, buildings, and infrastructure. Since these
14 projects are typically large and expensive, the citizenry should
15 have the ability to publicly inspect projects completed or
16 pending and information related to those projects.



1 The purpose of this Act is to require the executive branch
2 of the State to develop and maintain a publicly accessible
3 online project management platform.

4 SECTION 2. Chapter 103, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
5 amended by adding a new section to part I to be appropriately
6 designated and to read as follows:

7 "§103- Capital improvement projects; online project
8 management platform. No later than _____ , governmental
9 bodies of the executive branch of the State shall develop and
10 maintain an online project management platform that shall:

- 11 (1) Be available to be viewed and searched by the public;
- 12 and
- 13 (2) Contain a list of capital improvement projects that
14 have been completed in the past five years and
15 projects in progress with information detailing the
16 project, including but not limited to:
 - 17 (A) The status of the project;
 - 18 (B) A description of the project;
 - 19 (C) The identity of the awarded vendors;
 - 20 (D) The amount of funds allocated and expended; and
 - 21 (E) The location of the project."



A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TECHNOLOGY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. (a) The office of enterprise technology
2 services shall establish and develop an artificial intelligence
3 government services pilot program.

4 (b) The office of enterprise technology services shall
5 work with the appropriate state and county agencies to provide
6 state and county government services to the public through an
7 internet portal that uses artificial intelligence technologies.
8 The state and county government services provided through the
9 program may include but not be limited to the following:

- 10 (1) Unemployment services;
11 (2) Issuance of death certificates;
12 (3) Issuance of building permits; and
13 (4) Issuance of driver's licenses.

14 (c) The office of enterprise technology services may
15 consult with experts currently engaged in artificial
16 intelligence research in the implementation of the pilot
17 program.



1 (d) The office of enterprise technology services shall
2 submit a report to the legislature, no later than twenty days
3 prior to the convening of the regular session of 2025, of its
4 findings and recommendations, including any proposed
5 legislation, arising from its research or establishment of the
6 pilot program pursuant to this Act.

7 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
8 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
9 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 to
10 establish an artificial intelligence government services pilot
11 program.

12 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the office of
13 enterprise technology services for the purposes of this Act.

14 SECTION 3. In accordance with section 9 of article VII of
15 the Hawaii State Constitution and sections 37-91 and 37-93,
16 Hawaii Revised Statutes, the legislature has determined that the
17 appropriations contained in H.B. No. , will cause the state
18 general fund expenditure ceiling for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be
19 exceeded by \$ or per cent. In addition, the
20 appropriation contained in this Act will cause the general fund
21 expenditure ceiling for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be further




1 exceeded by \$ or per cent. The combined total
2 amount of general fund appropriations contained in only these
3 two Acts will cause the state general fund expenditure ceiling
4 for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be exceeded by
5 \$ or per cent. The reasons for exceeding the
6 general fund expenditure ceiling are that:

- 7 (1) The appropriation made in this Act is necessary to
8 serve the public interest; and
9 (2) The appropriation made in this Act meets the needs
10 addressed by this Act.

11 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2024.
